HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: We're on the record in the matter of the employees of Temple University, which is docketed at PERA-R-14-400-E, and this is the sixth day of hearing.

Before we go anywhere, will Temple stipulate that the adjuncts are professional employees under Act 195?

MS. FARMER: Yes.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Do you want to call your first witness?

MS. FARMER: Yes. Michael Bognanno.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: You can sit down.

Can you raise your right hand?

MICHAEL BOGNANNO

having been duly sworn, testified as follows:

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Please state your name.

THE WITNESS: Michael Bognanno.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Can you spell

that?

THE WITNESS: B-o-g-n-a-n-n-o.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Thanks.

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MS. PARMER:

- Who is your employer? ο.
- Temple University. A.
- How long have you worked for the university? Q.
- Α. For 25 years.

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- What's your current position? Q.
- A. I'm the Chair of the Economics Department.
- ο. In what college?
- In the College of Liberal Arts. A.
- Were you part of the Economics Department when it was part of the Fox School of Business?
- Yes, I was.
- 12 How long have you been Chair of the Economics 13 Department?
 - For five years. Α.
 - What are your job duties as Chair?
- I allocate the department budget. I set the tasks 17 for department committees, assign people to the committees. 18 I'm responsible for the scheduling of courses and staffing
- 1.9 those courses. I have a role in evaluating department personnel. I submit the hiring requests and am involved in 21 department hiring. I deal with student grievances. There's
- 22 a lot of tasks.
- 23 What other positions have you held at Temple over the last 25 years? 24
 - For one year, I was Academic Director of the

Executive MBA program, and I was Director of the Master's

Program in Economics at the Temple University Japan campus,

and I was Director of Economics and Business on the Japan

campus as well.

- Q. And do you hold a faculty appointment?
- A. Yes, I do.
- - A. I'm an Associate Professor in the Economics Department.
- Q. Are you tenured?
- li∥ A. Yes.

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MS. FARMER: This will be 56.

(Whereupon, the document was marked as Temple Exhibit No. 56 for identification.)

15 BY MS. FARMER:

- Q. I'm showing you what we've marked as Temple Exhibit
- 56. Can you identify this document, please?
- ¹⁸ A. Yes. This is my résumé.
 - Q. Do you have adjunct faculty teaching in the Economics Department?
- ²¹ A. Yes.
- Q. Do full-time faculty receive periodic performance evaluations in your department?
- A. The untenured tenure-track faculty get an annual
 performance review that we have to submit to the CLA Dean's

office.

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- Q. Are there also periodic performance evaluations done of NTTs?
- A. Yes. The personnel committee in the department and myself do an annual performance review of NTTs.

MS. FARMER: This will be 57.

(Whereupon, the document was marked as Temple Exhibit No. 57 for identification.)

MS. ROSENBERGER: Shannon, before you ask any questions, can you give me a minute to review this?

MS. FARMER: Sure.

(Pause.)

- A. The revenue deployment to some extent could be discussed at the department meeting, but I view that more as my job to make those decisions with consultation. It's not like something that they would vote on in a department meeting, but it's something that could be discussed.
- Q. Do full-time faculty attend these meetings?
- 13 A. Yes, they do.
 - Q. Does that include NTTs?
 - A. Yes, it does.
 - Q. Is there a secretary?
- A. There has been a secretary.

5	A. No. They don't serve on the hiring committee.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Do you want to

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move for Temple 56 through 60 then? 2 MS. FARMER: Yes, please. 3 HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Any objection? MS. ROSENBERGER: No. 3 HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Temple 56 through 6 60 are admitted. 7 (Whereupon, the documents marked as Temple 8 Exhibits Nos. 56 through 60 were received in 9 evidence.) 10 MS. ROSENBERGER: I did move for admission of 11 my remaining ones last time, didn't I? 12 HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: I think so. Let's 13 go off. 14 (Discussion off the record.) 15 HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: We're back on. 16 The parties have an additional stipulation 17 they want to submit? 18 MS. ROSENBERGER: I wouldn't refer to it as 19 stipulation. It's not factual, but we have an agreed-upon 20 statement. 21 HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: 22 MS. ROSENBERGER: Temple has presented 23 witnesses who testified about the university and a variety 24 of schools, colleges and departments. Temple is prepared to

present additional witnesses who will provide consistent

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testimony about other schools, colleges and departments.

Temple will dispense with calling additional witnesses from different schools/departments who would provide that testimony.

In turn, TAUP will not argue that Temple did not put on witnesses from enough schools and/or departments to provide evidence to support Temple's position about the respective roles of tenure/tenure track, NTT and adjuncts. However, TAUP reserves its right to advance any other arguments concerning the roles of full-time and adjunct faculty or any other issue in this matter, including, but not limited to, arguing that the evidence presented by Temple is not determinative of the issues presented in this matter, that any or all of Temple's evidence should not be credited and/or that the roles of full-time and adjunct faculty are not uniform among all departments in the TAUP bargaining unit.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Is that agreeable, Ms. Farmer?

MS. FARMER: Yes.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Is there anything else today?

MS. ROSENBERGER: Not from us.

MS. FARMER: We rest.

HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: Off the record.

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1 (Discussion off the record.) 2 HEARING EXAMINER POZNIAK: We're back on the 3 record. 4 We discussed briefs off the record. 5 parties do want to submit briefs in support of their respective positions, and I think the agreement is that 7 briefs will be due three weeks from the date of receipt of 8 today's transcript.
